



History of the Gospel

The first missionary to the Cook Islands, John Williams landed on Aitutaki before any of the other islands in the group and thereby established the first imprints of Christianity within our nation, which later progressed onto Rarotonga and the remaining islands of the Cook Islands thereafter. Furthermore as a result of the work and dedication of John Williams and other missionaries who later joined the (LMS) Evangelical work in the Cook Islands, Cook Islanders themselves who were converted and later trained at Takamoa Theological Seminary continued and were responsible for extending the Gospel's boundaries through mission work, into the Pacific.

In essence, Cook Islanders were pioneers into the mission fields of the Pacific, their contribution to this day is widely respected and honoured by those respective island countries.

From 1821 to 2021, back on Aitutaki where it all began, we will come together to celebrate the 200 years of the Gospel of Jesus Christ arriving in the Cook Islands that was introduced and has inter-woven into the very fabric of our people as Polynesians, as Pacific people, both culturally and spiritually. Every person, man, women and child, citizens of this country is invited to celebrate this remarkable life-changing historical event.
